Call to Worship: Isaiah 40.10-11 & Psalm 130.6-7

“Behold, the LORD God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; behold, his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.”

ALL: **“My soul waits for the Lord, more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.**

O Israel, hope in the LORD! For with the LORD there is steadfast love, and with him is plentiful redemption.” -Opening Prayer-

God calls His people into worship, not the other way around. His Word is the only thing that can truly draw our hearts into worship in Spirit and Truth. And so, we begin here.

Songs of Worship and Praise

Please feel free to worship in the way that the Lord is leading. Whether standing or sitting, hands raised or kneeling before the Lord. There is no required posture.

The Bible tells us to let the Word of Christ dwell within us richly by “singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs.” Thus, we sing of what God has done, and about our delight in Him.

Advent Scripture Reading: Luke 1.26-33

“In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, “Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!” But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.”

God’s Word is living and active. As the Holy Spirit gives us ears to hear it and hearts willing to receive it, we are comforted, built up, corrected and instructed when Scripture is read. So listen and be equipped.

An Advent Prayer

Faithful Father— At just the right time you sent forth your Son as our rescuer, to redeem those under the law, and to grant anyone with faith in him adoption into your family. Hallelujah. **Though the world lay long in sin and error pining, we praise you that ...**

Prayer isn’t just a private interaction with God, it is also a part of public worship. God calls His people to speak to Him as one unified body. “My” prayers become “Our” prayers as we cry out to Him together.

...Jesus at last appeared, and the soul felt its worth. Even so, like Mary, we are often troubled by things you allow in our lives. We are often confused and fearful. We hope too much in earthly things, and need our perspective broadened to praise for you for what you are truly doing. **Thank you our Father that the kingdom of Jesus is an everlasting kingdom that will never fade or crumble. The One who sits on the throne of David is our hope.** As we light the first candle of our advent wreath, we pray together: **Come, Lord Jesus; Our hope is in you, the Light of the World... (*Candle Lighting*)** “Wait for the LORD; Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the LORD.” Amen.

Preaching of God’s Word: Genesis 3.1-7

¹ So Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden?’” ² And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, ³but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.’” ⁴ But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. ⁵For God knows that when... Because God has spoken to us through His Word we strive to proclaim what it says and teach what it means. Through it, the Church receives training, correction, encouragement, and a deeper experience of the gospel of Jesus.

Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper

Please receive your communion elements from our elders up front. Return to your seat and hold them until all have been served so we can eat and drink together.

Followers of Jesus are invited to His table where He spiritually feeds His people.. Though these elements are common bread and wine, they symbolize His body and blood and “preach” to our senses that Christ abides in us and we abide in Him.

Benediction: Numbers 6.24-26

“The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.”

God gets the final word in the worship service. And with it He chooses to bless His people. That is what the word benediction means: “blessing.” Go in the peace of His blessing!
